



UTILITY MAINTENANCE WORKER

DEFINITION

Under direct supervision, performs a variety of tasks in the maintenance and repair of water distribution and sewer systems operating a variety of equipment and motorized vehicles.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Duties may include but are not limited to:

Cut, fit, lay, repair, clean and flush water mains and sewer lines; repair mains, valves and hydrants; replace water lines.

Inspect, test and operate valves, fittings and related water distribution equipment; perform repairs to fire hydrants and flow tests.

Operate trucks, backhoe, front loader, jetting and rodding equipment, jack hammer, trenching machine and related equipment and machinery.

Excavate and repair water and sewer lines.

Locate utility lines; assist in video inspection of pipes and lines.

Install traffic barricades to safely route traffic.

Perform related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS

Knowledge of:

Methods, techniques and equipment used in water and sewer line maintenance, repair and construction.

Standard safety practices required in water and sewer line maintenance and repair.

Supplies and equipment used in water and sewer line maintenance and repair.

Record keeping and reporting.

ABILITY AND SKILL TO:

Operate a variety of tools, equipment and vehicles including trucks, backhoe, trenching machine and jetter.

Operate office equipment including computers, copying machines and phone systems.

Read, interpret and apply technical information from manuals, drawings, specifications, layouts, blueprints and schematics.

Respond to questions from the public and staff.

Plan and organize work to meet schedules and timelines.

Communicate clearly both orally and in writing.

Perform duties of an emergency worker in the event of a natural or other disaster.

QUALIFICATIONS

Any combination of education and experience that would provide the required knowledge, abilities and skills is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the qualifications would be:

High School graduation and one (1) year experience in the maintenance and repair of water and sewer lines, including operation of equipment and machinery.

LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE

Possession of a valid Class C California Driver's License and a good driving record. Class B license with air brakes endorsement. Grade I Water Distribution Certificate. Grade II Water Distribution Certificate highly desirable.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS/A.D.A.

Ability to operate computer, calculator, telephone, portable radio, copying machine and light and heavy equipment used in maintenance operations

Ability to understand and respond to the public's and staff's requests for assistance both on the phone and in person
